
PRELIMINARY CONSIDERATIONS



- ALL persons present (athletes, technicians, family members, managers, etc.) at the event will be called PARTICIPANTS and, therefore, must respect and comply with this protocol in addition to any sanitary requirements prescribed by the authorities of the event venue (State and County).
- Participants who experience any symptoms of COVID-19 must immediately contact the designated competition physician.
- ALL participants in the competition must present a vaccine certificate and/or negative test report for Covid-19, namely:
 - Having taken the 2 doses of vaccine - it will also be mandatory to present a rapid nasopharyngeal/nasal antigen test performed up to 48 hours before the start of the competition or arrival in the country
 - Having not taken any dose or only 1 dose of the vaccine - the RT-PCR exam will be mandatory, performed up to 72 hours before the start of the competition or arrival in the country.

ENTRY INTO THE COMPETITION VENUE

For sanitary precaution, the presence of the public will not be allowed in the competition venue. Only the following people will have access:



Athletes, according to the hours of their respective matches, from 90 minutes before the start



1 accompaniment per athlete



- Technical Directory Personnel and staff;
- CBE, IWAS and CPB Directors
- Competition Medical Personnel
- Referees summoned
- 1 manager per federation
- 1 manager per club or fencing room




- In order to enter the competition venue, the temperature check is mandatory for all participants;
- Participant tested with a temperature of ≥ 37.8 degrees Celsius, or exhibiting any Covid-19 symptoms will undergo further examination and may be excluded from the competition, as per the medical assessment on site;
- ▲ Visible marks will be applied to those who pass the temperature test;
- Upon arriving at the competition venue, participants must go to the reserved area, maintaining a minimum distance of 1m between the others; avoiding physical contact (hugs, kisses, hand touching) with other participants;
- Fencing masks, gloves and fencing weapons must be disinfected by fencers prior to competition;

ENTRY INTO THE COMPETITION VENUE




Use of PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT




- Face masks are mandatory, except for fencers in combat and for fencers and their trainers in warm-up.
- Participants must have their own personal protective equipment.
- The referees, when active, must wear masks and visors (face shield) when approaching athletes, as well as hand sanitizer before and after each fight
- Staff personnel must wear mask and face shields when approaching athletes, as well hand sanitizer regularly
- CBE will make alcohol gel available to everyone at the competition venue

SOCIAL DISTANCE



- According to health safety standards, everyone present must keep a minimum distance of 1m from each other anywhere in the gym, including coaches when guiding their athletes on the track or off;
- The video arbitration consultation procedure must be adapted to maintain the sanitary distance. The main referee and the video referee must analyze the video separately, as well as respecting a minimum distance of 1 meter between them;
- In the event of physical contact with hands between people or objects, those involved should not touch their eyes, nose and mouth before performing immediate cleaning, washing their hands with soap and water or 70% alcohol.

MEALS



- It will NOT be allowed to eat in the common areas of the residential.
- Food consumption is restricted to the ROOM or designated area at the competition venue.
- ALL meals will be delivered by the CPB at the bedroom door according to the option chosen by each one, as follows:
 - Breakfast: between 7am and 8am
 - October 1st, 2nd and 3rd, will be delivered to the rooms between 6am and 7am
 - Lunch: between 12:00 and 13:00
 - Dinner: between 6pm and 7pm
